[1] *Sic.* The probate date could not have been 4 January 1724, since Thomas Guy's will was dated 4 September 1724 and he died 27 December 1724. This must be an error for 1725.

Note: These figures indicate that his closest relatives were made very rich indeed. Other relatives received lesser but generous legacies too; and servants received nice legacies as well. He then gave substantial amounts to several charitable purposes, first the equivalent of Can\$5.8M to pay the debts of and discharge at least 200 persons imprisoned for debt in London (para [54]; an annual income of Can\$2.3M to Christ's Hospital in London to yearly admit, board and educate four poor boys and girls (para [55], [56]); a fund to provide an annual income of Can\$730,000 to maintain fourteen paupers in his almshouse in Tamworth or provide apprenticeships to poor children there (para [57] to [63]); another Can\$5.8M to distribute as poor relief to housekeepers (para [64], [65]). The residue of his vast estate, not stated in the will but estimated at £219,499, comparable to Can\$1.3 billion today, he gave in trust to incorporate and finish building his enormous hospital for 400 "incurable" patients next door to and affiliated with St. Thomas hospital (para [69] to [79]). This was the first of the so-called "voluntary hospitals"-founded and financed privately.]

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
