AN ACT for the erecting of Hospitallf and Working Howses for the Poore.

W HEREAS in the Parliament held in the nyne and thirtieth yeare of the Raigne of the late Queene Elizabeth of happie memorie, a good Law was made, intituled *An Acte for erecting of Hospitallf or abiding and working Houses for the Poore*; but the Power Licence and Authoritie given by the said Statute to erect found and establish such Houses and abiding Places as are therein mencioned was confined to the space of Twentie Yeares then next ensuing, which said tyme is now expired;

[I.] St. 39 Eliz. c. 5. for erecting Hospitals and Workhouses, made perpetual

II. Hospitals, &c. erected since Expiration of 39 Eliz. c. 5. declared to be incorporated under that Act.

Be it therefore enacted by the Authoritie of this present Parliament, That the said Acte and all Thing *f* therein conteyned, shall from henceforth be revived and made perpetuall to have contynuance for ever.

AND be it alsoe enacted, That all Hospitallf Measons de Dieu ^[2] and abiding Places for poore lame maimed and impotent People, or for Houses of Correction at any tyme since the said Twentie Yeares expired, erected founded or made, or at any tyme hereafter to be erected founded or made according to the purport of the said Statute, shalbe incorporated and have p^{er}petuall Succession and Capacitie to have take and enjoy all other Priviledges Benefittf and Immunities to all Intentf and Purposes, according to the P^{ro}visions Tenor Purport and true meaning of the said Acte as if the same had byn made founded or endowed within the space of Twentie Yeares next ensuing the saide Statute.
