And be it further enacted, by the Authority afore faid, That the Governor, and Commander in Chief of the Province of *Nova-Scotia*, for the Time being, the Lieutenant Governor for the Time being; the Bifhop of Nova-Scotia for the Time being; the Chief Justice for the time being; the Secretary of the Province, for the Time being; the Speaker of the Houle of Allembly, for the Time being; His Majesty's Attorney General for the Time being; and His Majesty's Solicitor General for the Time being; shall be Governors of the said college.

> **III.** And be it further enacted, by the Authority aforefaid, That for the better Management and Regulation of the faid College, and the more full and compleat executing the Purposes of this Act, the faid Governors hereby appointed,

According to the House of Assembly Journal, the bill was read and passed by the house on 3 April 1789 (p 37), amendments proposed by the legislative council later the same day (p 40), amendments agreed to by the house on 4 April 1789 (p 40) and the bill received royal assent from lieutenant-governor John Parr on 9 April 1789, the date of prorogation (p 52). Under British parliamentary practice in this era, the act would have been retroactively deemed legally in force on 5 March 1789, date of commencement of the session. This new King's College was founded in Windsor, NS, by united empire loyalists who had lost their previous King's College in New York-which is now Columbia University. The college was made a university by royal charter in 1802 and claims to be the oldest university in what is now Canada. A disastrous fire in 1920 caused it to move to Halifax, where it still legally exists now in association with Dalhousie University, governed by the King's College Act, RNS 1998 c 44.
