## CHAPTER 74.

## An Act for the relief of persons professing the Jewish Religion.

[Assented to 7th April, 1890.]

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:—

Provisions of Rev. Stat. c. 237 extended to Jews. 1. All the rights, powers and privileges, conferred upon any religious society or congregation of Christians by the Revised Statute, Chapter 237, entitled *An Act respecting the Property of Religious Institutions*, are hereby extended to, and shall hereafter apply to any religious society or congregation of Jews, professing the Jewish religion.
